Message from our CDA Youth Representative, Lily Koorejian

The Dressage4Kids Weekend Equestrian Program took place on January 26-27, 2019. The featured equestrian for 2019 was Olympian Allison Brock.

CDA's your representative, Lily Koorejian, attended and shares her experience.

Olympian Ali Brock spoke each morning to all attendees. The first morning she described her personal path as a dressage professional. She stressed the importance of taking advantage of opportunities as they arose, but also about her work

ethic. She stressed the self-discipline and the willingness to work hard for what she believed in.

The second morning she talked about her specific path to the Olympics with her horse Roosevelt and her sponsor Fritz Kudurn. His support was wonderful, however, it was based on many years of her demonstrating that she was worthy of such generosity. She talked about a number of her mentors: specifically, Sue Blinks, Kyra Kyrklund, and Michael Barisone. Presently, Ali is devoting most of her time to teaching and mentoring younger riders, as she brings them along with the horses she and they are developing.

Throughout the day at D4K WEP, there were multiple sessions going on. There was a session about parasites and another session was a 'sit down' with Lendon Gray. One of my personal favorite sessions was Erin O'Neil's talk about incorporating cavalettis into dressage work. I thought this was a great introduction and easy learning curve for people who have never used cavalettis.

There are many different exercises for all kinds of athletic abilities. For example my horse does eventing. He loves to jump. so dressage is not his favorite type of work. When we use cavalettis in our dressage work, he becomes more focused. Cavalettis also help your horse engage their hind end.

I also really enjoyed Margaret Freeman's talk about the new dressage tests. She gave great insight about the new movements and she provided videos to show as a visual of what the judge is looking for.

I always enjoy D4K WEP because it is a great learning experience for riders of all ages and levels.
