Ride Critique Ride (RCR) Testimonials April 22 and 23, 2023 With Judge Bobbi Carleton Hosted by Sperry View Farm

From rider participant Kim Tester:

The clinic was so helpful as always. I was struggling with transitions from trot to canter and back so Bobbi gave Kara (my horse) and me an exercise to repeat as practice.

The most important tidbit of information I received



from Bobbi was to remember that sometimes the best thing to do is to "let go" instead of holding tighter onto the horse's mouth. It seems so easy to think about but counterintuitive to put into action.

The RCR gave me the opportunity to ride the test again so that I could practice thinking through

it all more quickly. To my surprise and delight, I remembered to let go at times. Allowing Kara to relax, and low and behold our score improved!

From rider participant Denise Clark:

There was a great turn out with nine rides filling each day. This format is a great way to start the show season. The participant registers with their test of choice. The test is ridden and scored just as in a show. After the judge finishes her remarks, she comes into the arena and reviews the test with the rider. Corrections and ways to improve the test are given and practiced. The participant can then ride the test again hoping to improve the score.

Bobbi Carleton has such a positive way of judging and reviewing the test with the rider and giving exercises for improvement. I rode my test and Bobbi reviewed what areas needed improvement. She then gave me exercises to do with my horse to achieve improved scores. Thank you to CDA for continuing to provide its members with such excellent clinics.

BIOMECHANICS clinic May 13, 2023 with Virginia Leary Hosted by Lost Run Farm, Litchfield CT

From rider participant Denise Clark:

CDA hosted a Biomechanics Clinic with Virginia Leary at Lost Run Farm in Litchfield, Connecticut.

Virginia's goal is to improve the rider's position in the saddle enhancing the balance between horse and rider. There were three exercises performed before mounting the horse. Two were leg stretches and leg position, and one for the core.

When mounted, Virginia placed a stretchy tape on the rider starting with the leg position and adding tape to seat, waist, back to shoulders and wrists while walking, trotting and at the canter as well. With each adjustment, the horse became more relaxed and supple. The rider's position appeared to be more centered and stable. It is so impressive to watch subtle changes to the rider have such a positive effect on the horse.

Thank you to Virginia Leary for showing us another way to improve our relationship with our partners.

Virginia Leary Bio:

Virginia is working to complete her coach's certification for biomechanics under Andy Thomas, former symmetry coach for the US and British Olympic teams.

This work enables riders and their horses to become straighter and more comfortable. Virginia has been teaching this method for several years in Maine, Massachusetts, Connecticut, South Carolina and Florida and she credits the program with her ability to walk and ride properly after a hip fracture in the Spring of 2022.
