This is our story:

I bred Moon from my QH stallion and a friend's cutting bred mare. His sire is foundation bred with

little TB influence which of course gives him that bulldog type build.

I raised and trained him at home with reining horse basics. I found my way to Western Dressage and competed him lightly until friends encouraged us to try Classical Dressage. I was hooked! He had lateral basics from early training, but we had a lot to learn.

We began competing at Schooling shows where I learned the importance of contact and being uphill. Getting a downhill horse to be uphill is quite a challenge! We worked at home in rain, mud, and snow to refine our partnership with infrequent but good instruction from some great teachers.

Our first year at rated shows we earned all but one score towards our bronze medal which we finished the following spring. In 2022 we earned our last score for a Silver Medal. We recently earned one score towards our Gold Medal and even if we don't get there, this journey with him had been the most rewarding experience of my life and he has taught me so much about precision, balance, listening and how important reward is to a horse. When a friend lost her horse to an illness, she earned her last score towards her Bronze Medal on Moon on her birthday.

Moon is my once in a lifetime heart horse. He always tries hard at whatever I ask of him whether in the sandbox, swimming in the ocean,

trail riding or pulling logs in full harness, he had a giving, kind nature and adores people.

Thank you CDA for recognizing my special horse and for the shows and clinics that give us all the opportunity to learn and grow as riders. We have enjoyed them all immensely!
